RULES FOR VISITORS

Climbing Park • Free Fall • Skill Bike Park



PLEASE READ BEFORE ENTERING

Activities in the adventure park involve risks of bodily injury. Before beginning active use of the park, every Active Participant is required to complete and sign a separate Declaration of Liability. Without a signed Declaration of Liability, Active Participation in the Park is not permitted.

1. WHO MAY ACTIVELY VISIT THE PARK

1.1 Courses — age and height restrictions

Each course is subject to a combination of a minimum age and a minimum safety reach (height with arms extended in a standing position). Both conditions must be met at the same time.

The safety reach is measured by the instructor on arrival using a fixed gauge. The condition is not height alone but also safety reach, measured with arms extended. The instructor's decision is final.

Maximum weight for all courses: 120 kg (harness certification)

1.2 Children under 15

- Children under 15 may take part in the activities only in the presence of an adult companion.
- Children under 8 (or under 10 for the blue, red, and black courses): the companion physically climbs together with the child.
- Children 8–15: the companion maintains visual contact and remains within calling distance.
- One companion may supervise no more than 3 children at a time.
- For children under 15, the Declaration of Liability is signed by the legal representative.

1.3 Health restrictions

Active use of the Park is not suitable for:



Persons under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or medication affecting coordination — no exceptions



Persons with epilepsy



Persons who have undergone surgery less than 10 weeks before the visit



Persons with heart conditions



Pregnant women

Entry is possible with appropriate precautions

- Asthma: carry your inhaler with you
- Diabetes: carry medication or glucose with you
- High blood pressure: only with stable, properly managed therapy
- Mobility impairments: the instructor will advise you of any potential risks
- Allergies: carry appropriate medication with you
- Psychological disorders: consult the instructor before entering



Responsibility for assessing your own state of health lies with you. The instructor is not a doctor. If in doubt, stay on the ground.

2. ON ARRIVAL

2.1 Reception

- Pay for your ticket and check in with the instructor.
- Sign the Declaration of Liability (mandatory for active participation; for minors, it is signed by the legal representative).
- Allow your safety reach to be measured.
- Use the restroom before putting on your equipment.

2.2 Clothing and footwear



Closed sports shoes with a non-slip sole



Comfortable, fitted clothing with no loose parts



Long hair tied back



Sandals, flip-flops, slip-on shoes, shoes with smooth soles, or high heels — prohibited



Scarves, ties, or loose belts that could get caught in the equipment — prohibited



Jewelry (earrings, necklaces, bracelets, rings) — remove before the activity



Mobile phone, keys, wallet — leave in a locker or in a bag on the ground

2.3 Safety training — mandatory for everyone

Safety training on the practice area is mandatory before entering the courses. There is no entry to the courses without it.

- Theory: the instructor explains the CBS system (Speedrunner Kanhook), the park rules, and the health restrictions.
- Practical test: each participant independently tries out the equipment on the practice area under supervision.
- The instructor must expressly authorize entry to the courses — only with their approval.



If you do not demonstrate competent handling of the equipment during the practical test, the instructor will not permit entry to the courses. This is a safety requirement of the standard, not a personal decision.

3. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

3.1 The PPE you will receive

PPE item	Purpose and note
Climbing harness	Mandatory on all courses except the yellow one. Fitted by the instructor on arrival.
Kanopeo Speedrunner Kanhook Ultimate	Continuous belay system (CBS). You are protected at all times — without interruption. Clip in on each course as you enter. NEVER open it manually.
Helmet	Mandatory on all courses except the yellow one. Must be worn at all times on the course.
Petzl Trac zipline trolley	For the zipline elements on the course. The instructor explains how to fit it on the practice area.
TruBlue QuickFlight XL	For Free Fall only. Fitted exclusively by the instructor — participants must not fit or adjust it themselves.
Yellow course — Little Bee	No climbing harness or CBS. Helmet not mandatory. Elements are below 1 m in height.



The CBS Kanhook system ensures you are connected to a cable at all times — there is never a moment without protection. Transitions between elements are automatic.

3.2 Rules for handling PPE

- Wear your PPE correctly fitted at all times during the activity — do not set it down on the ground, **do not hand it to anyone else.**
- The harness must remain correctly fitted and tightened at all times.
- NEVER open the Kanhook carabiner manually — only the instructor may do so, and only in exceptional circumstances.
- If you remove your harness during the activity (restroom, break): show your equipment to the instructor for a re-check before re-entering the course.
- Return all PPE to the instructor after finishing the activity.



Independently putting on, adjusting, removing, or repairing any component of the PPE after it has been checked by the instructor is strictly prohibited.

4. RULES ON THE COURSES

4.1 Basic rules

- Only 1 person is allowed on a given element at a time.
- A maximum of 2 people are allowed on a given platform at the same time.
- Do not step onto an element until the previous participant has fully reached the target platform.

- Walk only on the marked paths and courses.
- Prohibited: swinging, jumping, or shaking elements, bridges, and cables.
- Prohibited: standing beneath active courses or zipline lines.

4.2 The Kanhook CBS system — what you need to know

- When entering a course, clip the Kanhook carabiner into the belay system at the marked entry point (red marker).
- When moving between elements, the Kanhook carabiner is transferred to the next element across the safety plate.
- Zipline elements are marked in yellow: fit the zipline trolley as instructed by the instructor and wait for the line to be clear.
- Zipline rule: only set off once you can see that the target platform is clear and the line ahead of you is not occupied.



Stuck on the cable? Stay calm, do not unclip yourself — call the instructor by shouting or raising your hand. Wait for instructions. Self-rescue is prohibited and dangerous.

4.3 When to call the instructor immediately

- When you are unsure about the next step or feel afraid.
- When you notice any damage to the equipment, an element, or a cable.
- When another participant is in difficulty or stuck.
- If your helmet or harness strikes a hard surface — report it to the instructor immediately, even without visible injury.

4.4 Free Fall — special rules

- Free Fall is a separate attraction available for an additional fee.
- The entire clipping-in procedure is carried out by the instructor — do not interfere with the system.
- Do not grab the safety strap above your head during the jump.
- On the Free Fall platform, follow only the instructor's directions.

5. PROHIBITIONS



Entering the courses under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or medication affecting coordination — no exceptions



Manually opening or adjusting the CBS Kanhook carabiner or any component of the PPE



Entering the courses without correctly fitted PPE, without being clipped into the belay system, and without the instructor's express approval



Walking outside the marked paths; standing beneath the courses or at zipline landing zones



Smoking (including e-cigarettes) while wearing PPE, on the courses, or anywhere within the park area



Mobile phones, cameras, or small objects on the course — store them safely before entering



Aggressive or dangerous behavior toward instructors or other visitors



Using the park outside opening hours



Violating the rules will result in immediate removal from the park without a refund of the admission fee. The Operator reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone showing signs of alcohol or drug use or inappropriate behavior.

6. SAFETY AND PARK CLOSURE

6.1 Instructors

Instructors are identifiable by shirts marked INSTRUCTOR / CREW. They are responsible for:

- safety training and PPE inspection,
- supervising activities on the courses,
- technical rescue from height,
- providing first aid.

The instructor is not physically present with every individual at all times. The park relies on responsible conduct in line with the training provided. The instructor can be reached by calling out.

6.2 In the event of an accident or incident

- Call the instructor immediately by shouting or raising your hand.
- Do not move an injured person, except in the case of an immediate threat to life.
- Emergency call: 112

6.3 Park closure

The Operator has the right to suspend or close the park at any time in the event of:

- storms, lightning, strong wind, frost, or fog with visibility below 50 m,
- a technical fault in the equipment or infrastructure,
- following an accident — until the investigation has been completed.



If activities are suspended for safety reasons, you are entitled to an alternative time slot, a credit note, or a proportional refund for the portion of the activity not completed. A voluntary departure with a partial refund of the admission fee is not possible.

7. LIABILITY

7.1 Operator's liability

NOD, pustolovski park d.o.o. ensures that the park operates in accordance with standards SIST EN 15567-1:2015+A1:2020 and EN 15567-2:2020, that the PPE is certified and regularly inspected, and that a sufficient number of trained instructors are present in the park.

The Operator is not liable for damage or injury arising from failure to comply with these rules, reckless conduct, or overestimating one's own abilities.

7.2 Your liability

- By entering the courses, you accept that the activities involve unavoidable risks, including falls and bodily injury.
- Responsibility for the accuracy of health declarations lies with you or, for minors, with the legal representative.
- You are liable for damage to the PPE or to the Operator's property caused by negligent conduct.

8. NOD SKILL BIKE PARK

The NOD Skill Bike Park is a freely accessible cycling skills course located immediately next to the adventure park. There is no permanent instructor supervision — every visitor is responsible for their own safety.

RULES — NOD SKILL BIKE PARK

1. A cycling helmet is recommended for everyone. It is mandatory for participants in organized NOD park programs.
2. Suitable for all ages and skill levels. Children under 8 must be supervised by an adult.
3. Ride in the direction indicated on the marked course. Riding against the marked direction is prohibited.
4. One rider on an element at a time. Wait until the previous rider has cleared the element.
5. Before entering an element, check that the path is clear.
6. The park is FREE and open to the public — there is no permanent supervision.
7. Dispose of waste in the bins provided. Smoking and consuming alcohol are prohibited.
8. In the event of an accident: call 112. NOD park staff can be reached at the adventure park reception.
